#NiUnaMenos: Feminist Activism in Latin America

According to the Gender Equality Observatory of Latin America and the Caribbean, over 3,000 women were murdered for gender reasons in this region in 2018. From Argentina to Mexico and around the world, women have taken to public spaces with the green kerchief as their symbol to shout "enough" against sexist violence. That public space where women feel insecure – the same space where women are raped and killed – is now a space for protest, singing, and dancing. With images and video, Silvina Frydlewsky will discuss women's activism and how women across Latin America are confronting machismo and demanding social change.

Silvina Frydlewsky is an Argentine photojournalist who works as a South American correspondent for *The Washington Post*, *The Wall Street Journal*, and *El Pais* (Spain), among other periodicals.
